## President's Report for 2014 - 2015

I am very pleased to present the Alexandra & District Dog Obedience Club Inc Annual Report for 2014 – 2015. We have had a very productive and successful year with several new and exciting additions to our club programme.

February 2015 saw the introduction of a new Obedience Program. Over the summer break a small sub-committee worked hard to choose the content and structure of the programme. We now offer training at three different levels – Kinder; Family Companion Certificate and Advanced Levels A & B. Once again members and their dogs played together and competed against one another in some interesting games and relays.
