ALEXANDRA & DISTRICT DOG OBEDIENCE CLUB INC. CLUB RULES

The Committee and Instructors would like to welcome you to the Club. To help your Club run efficiently, we ask you to read and comply with the following rules:

1(a) CLASS ATTENDANCE Our programme is arranged in blocks of 6 weeks. Every 6 weeks there is an Assessment. To be eligible for Assessment you MUST attend a minimum number of classes.

The Foundation Programme:

- Kinder 4 out of 6 classes including the Assessment Class
- Transition 4 out of 6 classes including the Assessment Class

The Family Companion Course:

- Level 1 4 out of 6 classes including the Assessment Class Pass >60%
- Level 2 " " Pass >70%
- Level 3 " " " Pass >80%

1(b) ABSENCE FROM CLASS If you know you are going to be absent for an extended period, please inform your Instructor, who will arrange for you to continue at the appropriate level when you return to class.

- 2. Bitches "in season" are not allowed on the ground.
- 3. (a) No dog is allowed off lead at any time unless under an Instructor's supervision.
- (b) In the event of a dog running loose it is the responsibility of that dog's handler to regain control of the other dogs doing off lead exercises will immediately be put back on lead.

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- 4. Training fees must be paid before each training session and pick up your name tag which must be worn in Class.
- 5. Plastic bags are available in the Clubrooms, or from the Council dispenser at the end of the carpark, for you to clean up after your dog. We encourage you to carry a plastic bag at all times.
- 6. Children must be under supervision at all times and not interfere with classes.
- 7. No child under 12 years of age should be left alone in charge of a dog at the Club.
- 8. All dogs must have current C5 vaccinations and proof of vaccination must be sighted by a Committee member. If the vaccinations are three yearly, proof of annual kennel cough vaccination must be sighted by a Committee member.
- 9. A decision, by an Instructor or Committee Member, relating to a dog considered to be a risk to people or other dogs, must be strictly complied with
- 10. If you are not a financial member of the Club, you will not be eligible to handle a dog in class on training days.
- 11. The training ground and Clubrooms are non-smoking areas.
- 12. Appropriate footwear is required for training.
- 13. While checking in at the Clubrooms before class, please leave your dog in the car or tethered away from the verandah area. No dogs allowed in the Clubrooms.
- 14. Some dogs are wearing a yellow coat. Please give these dogs their personal space by not letting your dog rush up to greet them. Check with handler before you approach.
- 15. If you are instructed to put a yellow coat on your dog by a Committee Member, you must comply with this request. The yellow coat must be worn at all times whilst attending Alexandra & District Dog Obedience Club's training sessions and must not be removed unless instructed by a Committee Member.

We train weekly on Sundays, except for Easter, Long Weekends, the holiday months of December and January and (during Summer) days of Total Fire Ban.
